COLORADO

POST OFFICE NAME CHANGES

1859 - 1969

The recording and deliniation of changes in post office names would, at face value, appear to be a simple task. A change in the name of an office was made, the change was duly reported to the Post Office Department, and the Department recorded the change: end of problem. For the student of postal history, however, the question of post office name changes only appears to be simple. When research is extended beyond the simple observation of Post Office Department records, particularly into the question of determining the actual location of the postal facility, the problem becomes much more complex. It is soon obvious, when attempting to fit Department records to known physical locations, that the Post Office Department in Washington cared little about actual locations, and was more concerned with administrative continuity. Thus, a postmaster might "take" the post office name with him to a new appointment in a completely different location.

There are additional sources of confusion in the researching of name changes. One of the most bothersome is the minor changes in spelling which occurred often in early-day post office names. Such changes reflected errors in the original recording of orders of establishment, attempts at rendering Spanish names into English, adjustments of names to fit contemporary usage, and the shortening of cumbersome names to mention but a few. A particularly common practice was the collapse of a two-work name (Deer Trail) into one word (Deertrail). This effort was in vogue during the mid-1890s, and since that time most of those changes have reverted back to their original form. Changes of this type are sometimes complicated by the fact that the dates of the change were not recorded, and it becomes necessary to locate postmarks or other data to established the date of change. As a general rule, name changes which involve only a change in form and have not been recorded in Post Office Department records have been excluded from this study.

When the sources of confusion and error are recognized, it is evident that a researcher attempting to compile a "complete" list of post offices for a state should be able to interpret and reconcile the changes in names that occurred. It therefore seems desirable to list the possibilities which exist to describe the continuity of a post office.

- 1. Post office established; currently in operation, no change in location, no change in name. (Ex: Colorado Springs)
- 2. Post office established; since discontinued, no change in location, no change in name. (Ex: Colorado City)
- 3. Post office established; currently in operation, no change in location, name has been changed. (Ex: Black Hawk, formerly Black Hawk Point)
- 4. Post office established; since discontinued, no change in location, name was changed during operation. (Ex: Bald Mountain, formerly Nevada)
- 5. Post office established; discontinued or operating, location of the office has been changed, no change in name. (Ex: Dillon, operating; Placerville, discontinued)

Same location does not refer to the same building, but means that the office remained in the same townsite throughout its existence.

- 6. Post office established; discontinued or operating, no change in location, the spelling of the name has been changed. (Ex: Pine River changed to Pineriver, discontinued; Walsenburgh changed to Walsenburg, operating) In some cases the spelling may have reverted to the original form, i.e., Deer Trail to Deertrail to Deer Trail.
- 7. Post office established; administration and/or responsibility were moved to another townsite, and the office adopted the name of the new location. (Ex: Mountain City "became" Central City)
- 8. Post office established; administration and/or responsibility were moved to another townsite, but the old name was retained. (No example known for Colorado)
- 9. Post office established; discontinued and later re-established at the same townsite with a new name. (No example known for Colorado)
- 10. Post office established; no change in location, name changed. Office discontinued and later re-established at the same site with the original name. (Ex: Pallas changed to Higgins, then Higgins discontinued, later re-established as Pallas)

There is an additional possibility which, although no change in post office name is involved, can create a good deal of confusion for a postal historian attempting to accurately locate offices in time and space. In 1884, a post office was requested for the townsite of Magnolia in Arapahoe County. However, there was already a post office operating in Colorado's Boulder County named Magnolia, and so the new office was given the name "Duff." Several similar situations are known to exist, and they can be extremely confusing unless handled carefully.

While the two situations covered in 8 and 9 above are hypothetical on the part of the author when applied to Colorado, the complexity of patterns of changes known to have occurred in the state suggests that somewhere examples will be found of Colorado offices which fit these descriptions.

The complex tangle of information which characterizes research into the problem of post office name changes presents both a mystery and a pleasure to the collector or postal historian. Without the confusing and sometimes contradictory data, life would be much easier, but so too would the fun be gone. Through cancellations, corner cards, and other annotations, post office name changes can be documented and presented as a highly interesting postal history exhibit.

The following list presents, as recorded by the Post Office Department, the changes in name for those offices located within the borders of the present State of Colorado. The offices are listed in alphabetical order, according to the original name as provided in the first column. The date of name change is recorded in the second column, and the new name appears in the third column. If more than one name change occurred, the later names and dates are listed on succeeding lines. The last column identifies the county in which the office is now located, or was located at the time it was discontinued.

If the county name is preceded by "#", then the office was at one time listed as being located in another county. This reflects primarily the fragmentation of Colorado's original counties into the present number of 63, but on some occassions post offices are known to have physically moved from one county to another.

The notation "*" is used to indicate that a name has been applied to a particular post office more than one time. The notation appears before the original name for each office, but the name used in repitition is not necessarily the original.

The dates given for changes prior to 1931 are those listed in the series, "Records of Appointments of Postmasters - Colorado." Dates listed in this series can not be taken as "gospel" due to the slowness of 19th century communications, errors in recording and a variety of other factors, but in most cases they are the only dates available. The post-1931 dates are only approximate, and for the most part indicate the month and/or year in which the change was reported in supplements to the annual U.S. <u>Postal</u> Guide.

No attempt has yet been made to sort out the name changes according to the classification system described above. That refinement will require considerable further effort, and is currently being researched by John Willard, James Ozment and the author. Appreciation is expressed to John Willard of Denver who has, through correspondence, helped develop the concepts expressed in this article.


