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THE POST OFFICES OF WYOMING, PART III: LARAMIE COUNTY

Laramie County is unique among Wyoming counties in that it is older than Wyoming itself. The county was created by the Dakota Legislature on January 9, 1867, and included all of the territory under its jurisdiction which now makes up the State of Wyoming. Oddly, the remnant of that original Laramie County which currently survives had no population when the county was created. Carter County, organized out of the western half of Laramie County, would have been older than Wyoming too; but it lost its identity by change of name to Sweetwater. The Dakota Legislature also erected Albany and Carbon counties out of the original Laramie County territory on December 16, 1868, but that followed the Wyoming Organic Act of July 25, 1868. Later, Laramie County was further divided into Crook, Weston, Converse, Niobrara, Goshen, and Platte counties.

The Laramie County landscape is high rolling prairie where it laps up onto the Rocky Mountains. This topography provided a feasible route over the mountains along the western edge of the county, and it brought construction of the Union Pacific Railroad to Cheyenne in July 1867. The end-of-the-tracks town was made the county seat at about the same time, and promoted to territorial capital the following year.


The transportation industry has always been important to the county, and most of the early post offices were situated along railroad and stage lines. The famous Cheyenne-Deadwood Stage Line, for example, ran north out of Cheyenne and led to the opening of post offices at stations with such romantic names as Pole Creek, Horse Creek, Goodwins Ranch, and Little Bear. An alternate Black Hills route, known as the "lower road", went by way of Freels Ranch and Little Horse Creek. Railroads included the Union Pacific across the southern part of the county, the Cheyenne & Northern running northerly through the western portion of the county, and the Colorado Central and the Denver Pacific both extending south to Denver.

The far-flung cattle industry accounted for scattered postal facilities, particularly in the central part of the county. Development of dry-land farming techniques led to an influx of homesteaders in the eastern part of the county just after the turn of the century, and railroads were built to serve these new communities.

Favored by the site of the State Capitol, agriculture, ranching, railroads, and a permanent military establishment on the outskirts of Cheyenne, Laramie County has become the most populous in the state. Aside from temporary setbacks, the county has maintained a sustained rate of growth. Perhaps more than any other Wyoming county, Laramie demonstrates the shift in population from farm and ranch to town and city. The number of operating post offices has declined from a maximum of 32 in 1913 to 11, while the population has trebled over the same period to its present total of about 60,000.

The 73 post office names listed from Post Office Department records for Laramie County include 11 name changes, 3 name duplications for essentially different offices, and 5 post offices which appear never to have operated at all. There are some mysteries. For example, it is not certain that the Myra office was actually ever in Laramie County. Sidney, an office in Nebraska, was never closer than 50 miles from the county, yet it was listed as being in Laramie County and is included in this listing because of the existence of covers bearing postmarks which read "Sidney, W. T."



NOTES & ABBREVIATIONS

(1) No such name as Big Horse Creek; Horse Creek, as distinct from Little Horse Creek, is probably meant.

(2) No such name as Pineville; Pinebluff is probably meant. "M. to -" indicates mail or papers sent to another post office. "N. ch. to -" indicates a change in the name of the post office, which was sometimes, but not always, accompanied by a change in location. "At the Chaverne City and the Sidney post offices were established."

Both the Cheyenne City and the Sidney post offices were established prior to the creation of Wyoming Territory.
