#### INTRODUCTION

What follows is more of a progress report than a finished piece of research. It is a statement which summarizes the combined knowledge of over 40 contemporary students of Western postal history on the subject of an early 20th century postal marking commonly known as the Doane numeral cancellation. Through the cooperative efforts of these individuals, it is believed that we are currently able to document some 60% of the distribution and use of these Doane numeral cancellations among post offices in the eleven Western states and Alaska. Since official records of the actual distribution are lacking, if indeed they ever existed, the knowledge presented herein has been painstakingly assembled from surviving collections and accumulations of envelopes and post cards dating from the period of interest; roughly 1903 - 1915. The fact that we are able to present a listing believed to be 60% complete is therefore rather impressive, but it must be emphasized that many more examples of these postmarks will be discovered. Hopefully, future listings will see significant increases in the estimate of completion.

#### WHAT ARE DOANE CANCELLATIONS?

Postal historians are well aware of the poor quality of handstruck postal markings on first class mail around the turn of the century. The Post Office Department, too, was fully cognizant of the faint and incomplete markings made by the then current metal stamping devices. As early as December 1899, the Department began to test a new type of postmarker in the Rural Free Delivery service. This new equipment consisted of a rubber duplex device containing postmark data with the initials "R.F.D" in four straight lines to the left, and a numeral in the bars of the cancellation section at right (Figure 1). This numeral

denoted the rural route source of the mail. Distribution of this type of device continued into the early years af the 20th century, and was terminated by June 1903.

Early in 1903, after three years of successful testing with the RFD system, the Department began distribution of a device with similar, but slightly different, format to a small number of fourth-class post offices around the nation. This new device differed from the RFD postmarker/canceller by reinstating the circular postmark dial. It retained the number in the cancellation section, but in this case the numeral served an entirely different purpose.

The significance of the numbers in the canceller section of the device distributed to small post offices is indicated by the following note in the Postmaster General's Report of June 30, 1904:

"The successful experiments with about 500 postmarking stamps during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1903, have led to the permanent adoption of this class of postmarking supplies for the smaller fourthclass offices. An additional 10,711 were so equipped nation-wide with rubber postmark outfits during the next year. Most of these were for new offices and old ones requiring new supplies, where the gross receipts did not exceed \$500 per innum. Quite a number, however, were furnished to the larger fourth-class offices and to some of the second and third class offices when requested by their postmasters. It appears reasonably certain from these experiments that these stamps may be used to great advantage by offices at which the gross receipts are less than \$1000 per annum."

Careful scrutiny of the OFFI-CIAL REGISTER for the years 1905 and 1907, which list Postmaster Compensation for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1905 and 1907, reveals a near perfect correlation between the dollar volume of compensation for the year previous to the receipt of a Doane numeral postmarker and the number in the cancellation section of the device. In existing offices where Postmaster Compensation was less than \$100, the new postmarker contained a "1" in its cancellation

section. When compensation was between \$100 and \$200, the number was a "2", and for each additional \$100 increment in Postmaster Compensation the number was increased by one. When Indio, California, was issued a Doane-type postmarker sometime in late 1905 or early 1906 to replace its worn old equipment, the POD noted that Indio's Postmaster was paid \$474 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1905, and Indio was issued a device with a number "5" in the cancellation bars. This method of fixing the number in the cancellation was generally applied to old offices receiving new equipment. also applied to new post offices created by a change of name. For example, when Swink, Colorado, was established February 7, 1906, by a change of name from Fairmount, the POD noted that the Fairmount Postmaster was paid \$146 in the previous fiscal year and issued the new Swink office a device with a "2" in its cancellation. A similar solution was applied to those few offices which were issued two different sets of Doane-type equipment. When a post office was established at Englewood, Colorado, in late 1903, it was issued a Doane device with a "1" in the killer bars, the standard practice for new offices. In a short time, however, the Englewood office requested new equipment -- probably due to the wear occassioned by a rather busy office. Late in 1905 or early in 1906 Englewood received a second Doane device, and, since the Postmaster Compensation had been Postmaster Compensation \$504 in the previous fiscal year, this new device incorporated a "6" in its cancellation.

New post offices, that is those established or re-established from the time the program began in autumn of 1903 until late 1906, generally were issued devices with a "1" in the cancellation. This is the reason why so many Doane numeral cancellations are found with a "1" in the bars, and it indicates that the existence of a "1" does not necessarily mean that the office was a low volume facility. There were apparently a few exceptions to this practice of issuing a "1" to new post offices, other than those created by name changes, but in the examination of over 2,000 offices in the West the only documented exception was Fairbanks, Alaska, the

mining boom town which received a Doane device with the number "15".

Another feature of Doane numeral cancellations, which makes them a particularly interesting aspect of early 20th century postal history, is the fact that they occur in three major distinct types. Given a clear example with which to work, it is quite easy to identify the particular type and thus to know something about when the marking was first used for the different types were introduced at different times in the program. Before proceeding to a discussion of the various Doane types, a word of explanation is in order regarding the name applied to this postmark.

#### WHY ARE THEY CALLED DOANES?

The name honors Edith R. Doane, an accomplished student of postal history, who first became interested in these early 20th century markings in the 1950's. According to Miss Doane, the name Doane Cancellations was first applied by the late Ed Payne of Salem, Oregon, himself a noted postal historian and one of the early contributors to Edith's research. In recent years Miss Doane's research on the use of Doane cancellations in the West was made available through a series of articles which appeared in LA POSTA beginning in February 1978. This series was nearly complete failing health forced Miss Doane to curtail her research activities. At that time she requested the editor of LA POSTA to continue the project, and this report represents the fruits of that continuing effort by dozens of postal history buffs who were stimulated by the work of Edith R. Doane.

#### **HOW DO THE DOANE TYPES DIFFER?**

Three major distinct types of Doane numeral cancellations are known to exist. Within each of these major types there are several varities. The major types, known simply as Types 1, 2 and 3, were introduced by the Post Office Department at different times during the 1903-1906 period, and the numbering of the types is based on their chronological order of introduction.

The most readily identifiable distinguishing feature of Type 1




Figure 2. Type 1 Doane format.

Doane cancellations is that they have five killer bars instead of four (see Figure 2.) The bars are

arranged in a parallel manner with an unbroken bar at top and bottom, and three broken bars between. The number is positioned in the gap between broken bars.

Type 1 postmark dials usually measure 27 to 29 mm. in diameter, but, since this is the same range used for Type 2 cancellations, dial diameter alone can not be used to

verify Type 1.

Lettering used in the name of post office and state is generally one of three types. Longer names typically appear in a tight block type, c.f., BALLS FERRY or CHINA FLAT, California. Shorter names generally appear in either Romanesque style, c.f., SKYE or BISSELL, Washington, or in an elogated block style, c.f., GATE or TOLT, Washington. Unfortunately, their are quite a few exceptions to these general practices. Some longer names, e.g., EATONVILLE, Wash., appear in elon-ated block, and some in Romanesque, e.g., QUINTETTE, Cal. Some shorter names appear in tight block, e.g., DRYDEN, Oregon. One theory concerning this difference in type face holds that different manufacturers were involved, and these minor differences simply result from the various contractors operating independently within broad POD guidelines.

In addition to differences among the type faces used for post offices and states, there are also differences in the size and shape of lettering used in time indicia, and the shape of numbers used in the cancellation sections. A particularly interesting documented example is the case of MESA, Colorado. Two Type 1 Doanes are known. Both employ similar type face in post office and state name, but in one the lettering is inset more from the dial. Other

differences may be noted in the size and shape of the date/time indicia and the shape of the number in the killer bars. The date/time indicia were removable slugs, but the office and state names and the killer number were a permanent design feature. The only reasonable conclusion here, is that for some reason Mesa was issued two different Type 1 Doanes.

issued two different Type 1 Doanes.
Distribution of Type 1 Doanes was made to some 500 post offices nation-wide during the first half of 1903 according to the Postmaster General's Report quoted earlier. No records are known to exist identifying these offices. Since there were roughly 80,000 post offices in the nation in 1903, and only about 6,000 of these were in the 11 Western states plus Alaska, probabilty suggests that only 35 to 40 Type 1 Doanes were sent to offices in the West prior to July 1903. Research thus far has been able to document the use of Doane devices at only three post offices in the West prior to June 30, 1903. These are: WARREN, Oregon (April 18), PROVIDENCE, Arizona (May 11) and TOLT, Washington (June 5). One other office -- MAR-TINSDALE, Montana -- has been recorded with a July 1903 date. This lack of early 1903 dates is somewhat surprising, but the time was still prior to the major wave of post card mania in the U.S. and the volume of business at offices selected for the experimental distribution was low, Hopefully more early 1903 examples will be discovered as research continues. It should be emphasized that only existing offices received Doane devices prior to July 1903. Newly established offices were still supplied with metal circular stamps.

The more general distribution of Type 1 Doane cancellations began in the autumn of 1903. Newly established offices listed in the POSTAL BULLETIN between August 28 and September 30, 1903, received Type 1 Doane cancellations. Offices listed prior to that date received steel circular date stamps. Offices listed after that date received Type 2 Doane devices. It must be emphasized that postmaster appointment dates were not the determinant of postmarking equipment, it was the effective date of operation as listed in the POSTAL BULLETIN that mattered. Listed below are the 30 Western

post offices established or re-established during the period when Type 1 Doane devices were being distributed. Those starred have been documented with known Type 1 use. Offices are listed in the chronological order in which they appeared in the POSTAL BULLETIN. Listed dates

are Postmaster appointment dates.

Since Type 1 devices were distributed as initial postmarking equipment during this limited 1-month period, it may be assumed that their distribution as replacement equipment took place during the same time period. In summary, distribution of Type 1 Doane cancellations to Western post offices apparently took place in one of three parently took place in one of three ways: 1) during the experimental period prior to July 1903; 2) to newly established offices which began operations during the period August 28 to September 30, 1903; and, 3) offices receiving replacement postmarking equipment during September 1903.

The number of Western post offices known to have used Type 1 Doane cancellations currently stands at 111. Distribution according to state is as follows:




Figure 3. Type 2 Doane format.

Type 2 Doane Cancellations differ most obviously from Type 1s in the arrangement of their killer bars. Type 2 killer bars consist of four pairs of very thin lines arranged parallel to each other. The top and bottom pair are complete, and the two center pair are broken (see Figure 3). The number is again

positioned in the gap between the center bars. One difficulty which frequently confuses identification of this type is that the thin pairs of lines often began clogged with ink after considerable use, thus giving the appearance of solid bars.

The dial diameter usually varied between 28 and 30 mm., but here again prolonged use often resulted in a swollen appearance. Some Type 2 examples appear to have postmark

dial diameters as large as 32 mm.

The type face used in rendering post office and state name was generally Romanesque or tight block. Elongated block was rarely, if ever, used in Type 2. As a rule, longer names appear in tight block, and shorter names in Romanesque, but as in the case of Type 1 there are some exceptions.

Probably the surest way to identify a Type 2 device from a Type 3 on an example in which the killer bars are indistinct or questionable is the style of type. If the office name appears in Romanesque, the example is either Type 1 or Type 2, and if there are four killer bars instead of five, then it must be a Type 2. Postmark dial diameter is helpful, but as we shall see there are a few variant Type 3 devices incorporating dials less than 32 mm.

The distribution of Type 2 de-

The distribution of Type 2 devices began with newly established post offices listed in the POSTAL BULLETIN of October 1, 1903. BIG TREES, California, HALFWAY, Colorado, and MONTBOURNE, Washington, were the three new Western post offices listed in that issue of the BULLETIN. Two of them are known to have used Type 2 devices; MONTBOURNE is undocumented. Once again, Postmaster appointment dates had no bearing on the type of equipment received. TALHEIM and PORT KENYON, California, both had appointment dates in August, but were not listed in the BULLETIN until early October. They both received Type 2 devices. TOLCHACO, Arizona, with a Postmaster appointment date of March 31, and CHICKEN, Alaska, with a Postmaster appointment date of March 14, were also issued Type 2 Doane devices. They both appeared in the BULLETIN between October and December 1903.

Distribution of Type 2 devices continued until the summer of 1905. Post offices established prior to June 30, 1905, and presumably those receiving replacement equipment prior to that date, were issued Type 2 Doane devices. After that date new offices received Type 3 equipment. The period of issuance of Type 2 Doanes thus lasted some 21 months. As the Postmaster General noted, some 10,711 offices nation-wide were equipped during the 1904 fiscal year, and we may suppose that roughly another 12,000 were so equipped during fiscal year 1905. The majority of these offices received Type 2 devices. In the West the number of offices issued Type 2 devices is estimated at between 1700 and 1900. We document herein somewhat more than one thousand.




Figure 4, Type 3 Doane format.

Type 3 Doane cancellations employed a killer consisting of four solid parallel bars. The top and bottom bars were unbroken; the two center bars were broken (see Figure 4). A number appeared in the gap between the broken center bars. The killer bars of Type 3 were generally thicker than those of Type 1, and, in fact, the greatest confusion associated with proper identification of Type 3 usually is made between a

marking of this type and the first true 4-bar postmark, which saw introduction in late 1906. If the bars are obscured or incomplete, it is virtually impossible to distinguish a Type 3 Doane from an early 4-bar postmark. The fact tat so many of our surviving examples occur overstruck on 1-cent greens paying the post card rate does not help matters.

The diameter of the Type 3 postmark dial was generally larger than those of Types 1 or 2. Typically measuring 31-32 mm., it was thus nearly identical with the 4-bar dial which succeeded it as the standard postmark of small offices.

Lettering of post office and state name in the Type 3 was accomplished through the use of either standard or elongated block type. Only one example of a Type 3 Doane using Romanesque style type is known -- HELIX, Oregon -- and this is thought to be an altered device. The bold elogated block lettering used for many post offices names of 5 letters or less is a good indicator of a Type 3 Doane. This type style was not commonly used in the 4-bars which followed. Unfortunately, many Type 3 Doanes used only the standard block type.

Post offices established after July 1, 1905, were issued Type 3 Doane cancellations, and distribution continued until late 1906. Type 3 Doane distribution to new office and to old offices receiving new equipment thus lasted some 18 months, and, while no totals are available from POD sources, it would appear that distribution to post offices in the West may have included 1400 - 1600 offices. Based upon current knowledge we are able to identify a bit less than 1000 of these offices.

In summary, the distribution of Doane numeral cancellations included

coverage is thus approximately 60% of the expected total Doane use.

three distinct types, all sharing the common design feature of a number positioned among the bars of the cancellation section. Distribution began during the first half of 1903 on an experimental basis to a limited number of small post offices. Perhaps as many as 40 Western offices were involved in this experimental phase. The full program began in September 1903, and for about one month new offices and old offices receiving new equipment were equipped with Type loutfits. The total number of Western post offices receiving Type 1 devices was probably about 200. The distribution of Type 2 Doanes lasted some 21 months, during which time some 1800 Western post offices probably received the equipment. Type 3 Doanes began to be distributed after June 1905, and, before they were phased out as new equipment in late 1906, an estimated Western post offices were equipped with them. The best estimate of the total number of post offices receiving Doane cancellations in the eleven Western states plus Alaska is thus 3,500, or very nearly one-half of the offices listed in operation as of June 30. 1905. This report documents the use of Doane cancellations at 2043 post offices in the West, not including the use of two or more Doane devices by the same office. Its overal1

#### ARE REPORTS UNIFORM GEOGRAPHICALLY?

Detailed knowledge of postal markings used by Western offices varies considerably from state to state reflecting the differences in interest by collectors and the research published by serious students. New Mexico, Arizona and Alaska, all territories in the early 20th century, have been extensively documented by postmark catalogs. While these catalogs are not complete, their existence for several years has spurred interest in the postmarks of these areas and the documented record of postmark use has become substantial.

Other Western states are collected and studied by varying numbers of postal historians, and the knowledge of this research by these individuals and their willingness to co-operate in it has also varied from state to state. The net result is a rather uneven geographic coverage of the West in this report. It is anticipated that publication of the report will spark an interest in those lightly reported states, and result in a greater degree of uniformity in future listings. The table below presents an estimate of coverage on a state by state basis:

These estimates have been calculated on the basis of two major assumptions. First, that knowledge of the postmarks of Arizona, Alaska and New Mexico is relatively quite strong, and therefore provides a reasonable indication of the expected percentage of offices using Doane cancellations in those states. Second, that the percentage of post offices using Doanes was roughly the same from state to state.

Known examples of Doanes for Arizona, Alaska and New Mexico constitute a bit more than 40% of the total number of post offices listed in operation as of June 30, 1905. The actual percentages are 39%, 46% and 44% respectively. If those offices which were established or re-establised during the 1903-06 period, but are undocumented during the period of Doane use, are added to the known Doane-using offices of these three states, the best estimate of total Doane use based on total 1905 post offices is a bit over 50% in each case.

This figure of 50% of 1905 post offices has therefore been chosen as the best estimate of the total number of offices using Doanes. In some cases estimates have been adjusted upward or downward slightly based on knowledge of the number of new offices established from 1903-06, which are as yet undocumented. These offices have been listed along with each state. Information concering dates of establishment has been taken from the standard published sources for each state, and in most cases is given as the Postmaster Appointment date. It is likely, therefore, that most, but not all, of the undocumented offices listed herein actually used Doane cancellations.

Perhaps a more conservative estimate of the uniformity of geographic coverage can be given by dividing the 12 states into thirds. Coverage within the top third, consisting of Alaska, Arizona, New Mexico and Oregon, is rather good; probably better than 75% of the total. The middle third consists of California, Colorado, Nevada and Wyoming. Here, coverage is fairly good, and probably averages 60%. In the lowest third, consisting of Idaho, Montana, Utah and Washington, coverage is rather weak, varying from about one-third to one-half of

the expected total number of offices using Doanes.

#### **HOW SCARCE ARE DOANE CANCELLATIONS?**

The question of scarcity, and its attendant consideration of value, is somewhat complicated when it comes to Doane cancellations. On the one hand, Doane devices were used during the great post card era in the United States, and because of this a very large number of examples have survived. It is not too difficult, or expensive, therefore, to assemble a collection with a fairly large number of Doane cancellations. Flea markets, antique shops, post card dealers, and cover dealer bourse boxes all often yield Doane cancellations priced under \$2. As a matter of fact, as this is written there are few in the business of selling postal history artifacts who make any distinction when selling Doane cancellations. Doane cancellations are not popularly collected per se, and are today valued on the basis of what state they are from, or, among the more enlightened, how long the post office was in existence.

Henry M. Spelman, III, conducts one of the better known regular auctions of postal history, and often sells lots containing Doane cancellations. A non-scientific survey of Spelman's last four auctions yielded the following information on the sale of Doane cancellations. All lots were on post card or government postal card. All lots were illustrated. All lots contained single items where the postmark was from a sending, not receiving, office. Here are the results:

Granted that 16 lots is not much of a sample from which to draw conclusions about scarcity, value and price, but it is sufficient to make the point that in the current market, price relates mostly to the popularity of the state of origin, the length of time the office was in service, and, of course, how many examples are in the hands of interested collectors. It may also be noted that prices vary widely in the above list. This variation is even more pronounced when it is pointed out that \$10 represents a minimum sale, and the lot may not have in fact realized that amount.

As long as the present pattern of collecting Doane cancellations only as part of the postal markings of a particular state or territory continues, it appears that examples from Arizona, New Mexico, Alaska, and to a lesser extent, Oregon, Nevada, California and Colorado, will command premium prices, often disproportionate to the relative scarcity of the postmark compared to states not so actively sought. Interest by collectors is not uniform among all the Western states, and that fact is likely to keep value and price from reflecting true scarcity on a region-wide basis.

Ignoring the question of value and price, let us concentrate on scarcity alone. Simply stated, scarcity describes the number of surviving examples of a particular Doane cancellation. If we assume a more or less constant survival rate, all the while knowing this is a foolish thing to do because great-aunt Minnie saved dozens of postals from her friend in that little hamlet in remote Montana, we can then guess about scarcity based on the history of the post office. In other words, an office which began operation in 1904, had a Postmaster Compensation of \$23 in 1905, and was discontinued in 1906, ought to be a tougher place to find Doanes from than an office which still functions and had a PM Comp. of \$456 in 1905. Generally, of course, this is true, but it represents only the extremes and does not provide guidelines which may be applied uniformly. In fact, consideration that an office is still operating may not directly effect the scarcity of a Doane can-cellation it may have used for a very brief time some 75 years ago.

In determining the relative scarcity of Doane cancellations two factors are of prime importance: volume of business and length of time the Doane device was in use. Based upon reports by the collectors contributing to this study, the most common Doane cancellations are those used at medium size offices (\$300 - 500 PM Comp.) for periods of time in excess of 5 years. Least common are of course those used by short-lived, low volume offices, but, surprisingly, examples from the very large offices such as Las Vegas, NV, Lakeview, OR, and Hailey, ID, are not too common. These high volume offices generally Doane devices for only a few months, and then gave them up in favor of more durable equipment. The listing of each post office known to have used a Doane device is accompanied by information regarding the period of service and 1905 Postmaster Compensation. This data may be used, along with known dates of use, as a rough quide to determining the relative scarcity of a postmark, but in order to be sure of scarcity it is necessary to determine a more complete history of the office in question, including particularly interruptions in service and PM Comp. during the entire period the Doane device was in use

### WHAT VARIATIONS FROM STANDARD TYPES EXIST?

Variations from the standard Doane formats described above are surprisingly few in number. Most of what might appear to be design or format variations are merely differences created by individuals using the device within its normal parameters, or the result of wear and tear over time. Variations in Doane cancellations might be grouped into three categories for discussion purposes: variations within design parameters, variations resulting from wear or damage, and true design variations.




Figure 5. Typical Doane Cancellation format.

Let us consider once again the basic format of the Doane cancellation. The device consisted of a simple rubber stamp attached to a wooden handle. The rubber stamp was laid out in a format similar to that shown in Figure 5 below. In the postmark dial section the office name and state were an integral and

fixed part of the design. Three, often four, slots appeared in the center of the dial for insertion of the proper date/time indicia. These indicia were apparently changeable, for they may be noted in nearly all possible combinations of order on surviving examples. The dial itself was free to rotate with respect to the bars of the cancellation section. It is not known if this was an intended or accidental feature of design, but many examples exist with the postmark dial appearing upside down with respect to the number in the bars. In the cancellation section, both the bars and the number were a fixed part of the design.

Given these design parameters it may be seen that within design variations include:

a) all possible orderings of month, day, A.M./P.M., and year,

b) substitution of a blank bar

for any of the above indicia,

c) inversion of any of

date/time indicia, and,
d) rotation of the postmark dial to any position with respect to the cancellation bars.

Variations resulting from wear and tear sometimes give the appearance of a dramatically altered device, and can on occassion give the impression that one has discovered a truly variant style of Doane cancellation. The following kinds of variations result from wear and tear, or in some cases, simply an imperfect strike applied by the postmaster or clerk:

a) indistinct or missing letin the office and/or state

b) indistinct or missing commas following office name or periods following state name,

c) indistinct or missing number in the cancellation section sharp, clear example documenting the existence of a Doane cancellation with no number in the killer bars has not yet been found, although many Weak or marginal strikes appear to have no number),

d) swollen or oblate postmark

dials, and,

e) disfigured or scalloped postmark dials. Figure 6 shows two

scalloped California examples οf Type 2 Doane cancellations. Two similar examples are known from CHAMITA, NM, and COCHISE, AZ. The CHAMITA, reason for this deformed appearance is suspected to be damage to the cancellation device resulting from heat. All four known examples have the same scalloped appearance. They were most certainly not originally made that way. The best guess appears to be that all four devices came into too close contact with a lamp, lantern or other source of heat, which disfigured the rubber stamp but did not render the device inoperable.

A few true design variations are known to exist, and, given the large number of offices involved in the program, more are expected to be found. Perhaps the most spectacular, and best known, design variation is the FAIRBANKS, AK, Type 3 Doane with both upper and lower case letters in

"FAIRBANKS." No other examples of Doane cancellations have been reported using upper and lower case lettering. The history of this Fairbanks device indicates that it was introduced early in 1907, replacing a standard Type 3 Doane which was in use as late as December 1906. The new device was used into the busy summer of 1907, but by July impressions made from it had become badly distorted. The latest known use dates from 9 August 1907, and by 11 September 1907 we find that Fairbanks was using a Receiving postmark to cancel outgoing mail. Use of this emergency postmark continued until it was replaced by a duplex in mid-October. The upper/lower case Doane was non-standard in one other respect; the number in its cancellation was a "1". Fairbanks in 1907 was a busy post office, and a "1" was in no way appropriate. Both the earlier Type 2 and Type 3 devices used a "15" in their killers. The non-standard lettering, poor quality construction implied by rapid deterioration of impressions, and inappropriate number in the killer all suggest that this Fairbanks device may have been constructed locally, or at least not
by a firm normally contracted to make Doane postmarking devices. Ιf this was the case, then we may not find any other Doanes with upper and lower case lettering.

Another apparently true variant is the Type 3 Doane used by HELIX, OR (see illustration in the Oregon section). This is the only example of a Type 3 device known to have used Romanesque, or serif, lettering. The lettering appears only in the name of the office, with "ORE-GON" in standard block. The history of use of this device is not known since only one date has been documented, but it is obviously non-standard and may have resulted from local alteration of a normal Type 3 Doane device.

A final true variant is the Type 3 Doane from SILVANA, WA. Here, variations from standard are not so spectacular, but the use of a smaller postmark dial (30 mm.) and thicker, squared-off killer bars give this postmark a significantly different appearance from the normal Type 3. It is believed that this Silvana device was constructed by a minor contractor, and that other

examples of a similar design may be found as research continues. At the present, however, this Silvana Type 3 is the only one of its design type known.

#### ORGANIZATION OF THE REPORT

The main body of this report is organized into twelve state sections. Since collecting interest is currently focused on specific states, rather than region-wide, it was believed that such an organizational scheme would be most helpful to interested users. Each state section begins with a summary statement describing the range of knowledge of Doane cancellation use therein, and indicating the names of those postal historians who have been most responsible for the de-velopment of this information. The summary statement is followed by an alphabetical listing of post offices known to have used Doane cancellations, the period of service of these offices, their Postmaster Compensation for the 1905 fiscal year, the type and cancellation number of Doane used, and the known range of dates of use. Following the main alphabetical listing, the names of post offices established or re--established from 1903 to 1906 are listed. Each section concludes with a few sample illustrations of Doane cancellations used in that state.

## Postal history source: Helbock, POSTMARKS OF TERRITORIAL ALASKA

The first decade of the 20th century was a time of rapid settlement expansion in Alaska. In many areas the Territory was still experiencing the excitement of new gold discoveries, and mining camps sprang to life and often died with considerable frequency during the 1903 to 1906 period. The result was a proportionally large number of new post offices established during the era of Doane cancellations, and this fact, combined with a high percentage of low volume offices already on the Alaska list, made for a relatively high proportion of Alaskan post offices using Doane devices.


On June 30, 1905, there were 97
post offices on the Alaska list. Two
years later the number had increased
to 121, representing a percentage
increase greater than any other
Western state or territory for the
period.

Thus far a total of 45 Alaskan offices are known to have used Doane

cancellations. One office, SEWARD, used both a Type 2 and Type 3 device, and one office, FAIRBANKS, used both a Type 2 and Type 3 device plus a variant Type 3 device. No Alaskan offices are known to have used a Type 1 Doane. There are 25 examples of Type 2 use and 23 examples of Type 3 use documented.

The earliest documented use of a Type 2 device in Alaska is 23 June 1904 from CATALLA, although a 25 June 1904 use is also reported from KENAI. The earliest reported use of a Type 3 Doane is 8 March 1906 from SEWARD.

The existence of a published catalog of Alaskan territorial postmarks has materially benefitted the completeness of coverage from the Territory. Only 14 post offices established during the 1903-06 era have not been documented. Most of these offices are expected to have received Doane devices as original equipment, and may eventually be added to the list of known users. Beyond some number of these 14, a very few as yet undocumented old offices are expected to be added to the Alaska list. The total number of Alaskan offices using Doanes is thus expected to total about 60.







#### **ARIZONA**

Arizona was still a lightly settled part of the southwestern desert country in the first decade of the 20th century. At the turn of the century its population numbered 122,931, but growth was rapid over the next decade, and by 1910 the Territory numbered 204,354 residents, and stood at the eve of admission to the Union. Mining, particularly of copper, was the mainstay of Arizona's economy, but major irrigation projects were begun as early as 1902, and the future of irrigated farming began to take shape.


The number of post offices listed for Arizona Territory on June 30, 1905, was just 259, exceeding only Alaska and Nevada among Western states and territories. A large percentage of these were low volume offices, but the number of new post offices added in Arizona between 1903 and 1906 was not proportionally large compared to other Western states.

Thanks to the ARIZONA TERRITORIAL POSTMARK CATALOG, a work originally authored by Dr. Sheldon H. Dike in 1972, and subsequently updated twice by Dr. Owen H. Kriege, we are able to document the use of Doane cancellations at 102 different Arizona post offices. Six offices (AZTEC, GRAND CANYON, NELSON, SAN CARLOS, SILVERBELL, and WINKELMAN) are known to have used both Type 2 and Type 3 Doanes. Four Arizona offices are known to have used Type 1 devices. Sixty-eight Type 2 devices have been documented thus far, and 36 Type 3 devices are known to have been used.

The earliest Arizona use of a Type 1 Doane dates from 11 May 1903 by PROVIDENCE, and represents the second earliest recorded use of a Type 1 in the entire West. The earliest use of a Type 2 device was at TALKAI, and dates from 24 November 1903. Three Arizona post offices are known to have used Type 3 de-

vices as early as December 1905. The earliest use is currently held by QUARTZSITE (4 Dec), followed closely by HUMBOLDT (12 Dec) and MOWRY (23 Dec).


Current coverage of Arizona Doane use is believed to be quite good. The existence of the CATALOG for 10 years has brought forth contributions of data from numerous collectors, resulting in a listing estimated to be nearly 80% complete with regard to Doane use. Some 30 offices, as yet undocumented during the years when Doanes could have been first used, may be listed for Arizona. It is believed that most of these offices probably used Doane cancellations, and, given the possibility of a few old offices using Doane equipment which have so far escaped notice by the fraternity of Arizona enthusiasts, the best estimate of the total number of Arizona offices to use Doanes is about 130.



#### CALIFORNIA

California had an immense number of post offices in the early 20th century; almost twice as many as the next largest state. As the list of contributors suggests, the compilation of a listing of Doane use was a task to which numerous and considerable talents were applied.

The population of California in 1900 was a bit less than one and one-half million, and by 1910 it had increased to nearly 2.4 million. Most of this early 20th century growth occurred in southern California, with counties such as Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside and San Diego acquiring the lion's share of new residents. As with the differential pattern of population growth, so too changes in the distribution of post offices occurred in California during the Doane era. Many more new offices were established in southern California between 1903 and 1906 than elsewhere in the state, although, taken as a whole, the number of new offices established in these years for the entire state was proportionally somewhat low compared to the entire West.

The OFFICIAL REGISTER listed 1,619 post offices operating in California on June 30, 1905. That total represented nearly one-fourth of all post offices in the West. Quite a few of these California offices were high volume facilities, and thus too large to receive Doane equipment, but with over 1,600 post offices in all, the number using

Doanes was considerable.

We are now able to list 517 different California offices which used Doane devices. Interestingly, this number represents just about one-quarter of our total listing for the West. Only four offices are known to have used both Type 2 and Type 3 Doanes, and this rather small number is probably an indication that our records for California need

to be expanded. The four offices are: INGOT, LANCASTER, SLATINGTON and VENICE. A total of 25 California offices are known to have used Type 1 devices, while 280 have been documented using Type 2 devices and 216 are known to have used Type 3.

The earliest use of a Type 1 device, and incidentally the only known California Doane dating from 1903, was at PANOCHE. It dates from 10 October 1903. Certainly more 1903 uses are to be expected. The earliest use of a Type 2 device documented thus far was at PEPPERWOOD on 17 February 1904. Here, too, we should expect some late 1903 uses. The earliest known use of a Type 3 device occurred at SEQUOIA on 6


September 1905.

Even though a relatively small number of undocumented new offices (96) were established or re-established in the 1903-1906 period, it is believed that the total number of California post offices to have used Doanes may be as large as 810. If so, then there are still some 290 California Doanes to be reported. One factor complicating the assembly of a statewide listing of Doane use is the popularity of limiting California postal history collections to one county, or a small group of counties. Our list reflects this preference, for some counties, e.g., Humboldt, are much more complete than others.







The great mining boom, which started a settlement rush to Colorado in the 1860's, had slackened by the beginning of the 20th century, although Cripple Creek was still an impostant center of gold production. At the turn of the century the State's population numbered 539,700, and by 1910 the number of Colorado residents had climbed to 799,024. residents had climbed to 799,024. Much of this growth occurred in Much of Denver, which added nearly 80,000 to its population during the decade, but new settlements in the farming region of eastern Colorado also attracted newcomers during the era of Doane cancellations.

Colorado had some 757 post offices as of June 30, 1905, and ranked 4th amoung Western states. A large percentage of these offices served small mining camps scattered throughout the State's mountains, and, with the dawn of the dry farming era, quite a number of new com-

munities were being founded in eastern Colorado.

Our listing verifies the use of Doane cancellations in 221 Colorado post offices. Five offices (ARROW, ENGLEWOOD, HALFWAY, NEWETT and PROWERS) used both Type 2 and Type 3 Doane devices. Only 8 Colorado post offices are known to have used Type 1 Doanes, but more are expected to be reported. Type 2 Doanes were used by 125 offices, and Type 3 Doanes have been reported in use at 92 post offices.

The earliest use of a Type 1 device reported thus far was at NORRIE on 13 February 1904. Colorado uses in 1903 are limited to only one report of a DEER TRAIL Doane with no particulars as to month and day. The earliest Type 2 use is this DEER TRAIL, with a 8 January 1904 use at BEULAH the second earliest. On 9 December 1905 LT10N is known to have used a Type 3 Doane, for the earliest documented use of that type.


The record for Colorado is estimated to be about 60% complete. Some 87 as yet undocumented offices were established between 1903 and 1906, and it is anticipated that most of these used Doanes. In addition, the absence of 1903 dates and scarcity of 1904 dates argue for the eventual discovery of quite a few more Doane-using offices. The best guess is that the number of Colorado offices using Doanes was around 380.


COLORADO TYPE 1 DOANES

Idaho more than doubled in population luring the first decade of the 20th century, climbing from 161,772 in 1900 to 325,594 in 1910. The reasons for this growth included expansion of lands under irrigation, development of mineral resources -particularly copper and lead, and an increase in number and output of lumber mills.

The number of post offices in Idaho on June 30, 1905, was 537, ranking it 5th among Western states. A significant number of new offices were added during the 1903-06 period due to the extractive economic growth mentioned above. Since the vast majority of Idaho's offices served small, and often new, communities, Doane use is believed to have been relatively high.

We know of only 105 Idaho post offices that used Doane equipment. TWIN FALLS is the only office known to have used both a Type 2 and Type 3 device. Six Idaho offices are listed as using Type 1 Doanes. And the recorded use of Type 2 and 3 equipment stands at 54 and 55 post offices respectively.

The earliest known use of a Doane cancellation in Idaho is the 11 May 1904 Type 2 example from WARREN. The earliest Type 1 dates from 5 October 1904, and comes from both PECK and OLA. We have no known 1905 use of a Type 3 device. The earliest of record is 5 February 1906 from WINONA.


As the above information indicates, our current coverage of Idaho is rather weak. There may have been as many as 270 Idaho post offices using Doanes, and of that estimate we know of only about 40%. In addition, it is anticipated that date ranges can be significantly expanded

for those offices listed.

The quality of the two sources of information regarding dates of post offices operations is somewhat less reliable than sources used for other Western states. Listed dates of service should be considered as tentative.

#### MONTANA

was a vast, Montana lightly settled state in the first decade of the 20th century. It population was growing, but at a somewhat slower rate than other Western states. In 1900 there were 243,329 residents, and in 1910 the population was 376,053. Economically, Montana was divided between stock-raising in the east and mining in the west. Both of these activities produced many small settlements, and the use of Doane postmarking equipment is expected to have been rather widespread. The list of Montana post offices numbered about 508 in 1905, and quite a large number of these were recently established facilities.


Our listing of Montana post offices known to have used Doanes numbers on 80. No offices are yet known to have used two different types of Doane devices. We know of 5 Type 1 useages, 40 Type 2 useages and 35 Type 3 useages.

The earliest Montana Doane use of record is 20 July 1903, and is a Type 1 device from MARTINSDALE. A Type 2 device was used at HARDY on 5 September 1904 for the ealiest known use of that type, and HARRISON's use of a Type 3 device on 15 September 1906 is the earliest for that type.

Our coverage of Montana Doane use is weaker than for any other Western state. It is estimated that as many as 255 Montana offices may have used Doanes, and we know of less than one-third of those. There is obviously lots of room for the discovery of important new information regarding the use of Doane cancellations in Montana.


Following four decades of relatively slow population growth in the post Civil War era, the popula-tion of New Mexico Territory in-creased dramatically from 195,310 in 1900 to 327,396 in 1910. Much of this increase was associated with an influx of farm families, who, armed with the latest scientific theories on dry farming, were convinced they could make a living on the arid plains. The greatest population increases were concentrated along the eastern border of New Mexico, where new counties such as Quay, Roosevelt and Curry were created, and other arid plains such as the Estancia Valley.

On June 30, 1905, New Mexico had 414 operating post offices. Almost all served small settlements, in fact, Albuquerque, the largest population center in the Territory, had a population of only 10,000. This high proportion of small places, plus the relatively large number of new settlements coming to life as a result of dry farming expansion, made New Mexico an user of Doane equipment.


Thanks to the existence of Sheldon Dike's pioneering CATALOG, which was initially published in WESTERN EXPRESS beginning in 1958, the record of New Mexico postmark use during the Doane era enjoys a very high degree of completion. We know that there were 183 different post offices using Doanes. ESTANCIA used both a Type 1 and Type 2 device. Three offices (ESTEY, FRUIT-LAND and MOGOLLON) used both Type 2 and Type 3 devices. ROY used two different Type 2 devices; one with a #3 and one with a #4. STEINS used two different Type 3 devices; one with elongated block letters and one with standard block letters. There are 9 offices known to have used Type 1 Doanes, 104 that used Type 2 Doanes and 75 that used Type 3 Doanes.

Oddly, there are no 1903 Doane uses documented for New Mexico. The earliest known use dates from ROY on 11 January 1904. This was a Type 2 device. The earliest known Type 1 is CHIMAYO's 11 February 1904 use. ADEN has the earliest Type 3 of record. It dates from 25 October 1905.

There were 57 offices established during the 1903-06 Doane issuing period in New Mexico, which are as yet undocumented for the era and may have used Doane devices. The possibility exists that a small number of old offices may have used Doanes which are as yet unrecorded. In all, the number of New Mexico post offices to have used Doane cancellation may reach a bit over 210. Our listing is probably about 85 to 90 per cent complete.






Oregon experienced substantial economic and population growth during the first decade of the 20th century. Population increased from 413,536 in 1900 to 672,765 in 1910, and, while the state's economy was heavily depended upon a balanced group of extractive industries such as forestry, fishing, agriculture and mining, much of the population growth was centered on Portland, which swelled from 90,426 in 1900 to 207,214 in 1910.

On June 30, 1905, there were 816 post offices in Oregon, ranking the state third in the West. Quite a few of these offices were too large for Doane use, and because of the concentration of much of the new growth in and around Portland, it is believed that Oregon did not have a particularly high proportion of offices equipped with Doane devices.


A total of 303 Oregon post offices are known to have used Doanes. LENTS used both a Type 1 and Type 3 device, and three offices (ALMA, ARLETA and HOT LAKE) used both Type 2 and Type 3 devices. A rather large number of Oregon offices, 24, are known to have used Type 1 Doanes. The numbers using Type 2 and Type 3 devices are 187 and 96 respectively.

The earliest documented use of a Doane device in the entire West is that of WARREN, Oregon, dating from 18 April 1903. Oregon's earliest known use of a Type 2 is 14 April 1904 from SHERAR BRIDGE, and the earliest Type 3 dates from 21 December 1905 at FISHHAWK.

Only 42 undocumented offices were established in Oregon between 1903 and 1906. The possibility exists that Doane use will be discovered from previously unreported old offices, but it would appear that our knowledge of Doane use in the State approaches 75% of the expected total of about 410.







The rate of population growth Utah was not as high as some of its neighbors during the first decade of the 20th century. In 1900 the State counted 276,749 residents, and by 1910 the number had climbed to 373,351. At mid-decade Utah about the same population as Monand slightly more than Idaho and New Mexico. Despite that, Utah had far fewer post offices than any of those three states. This may be explained in large measure by dif-ferences in the settlement pattern of Utah from other Western states. Utah communities tended to be fewer in number with larger populations on average.

On June 30, 1905, there were 324 post offices on the Utah list. Of these, a relatively high proportion had Postmaster Compensations in

the \$200 to \$400 range, indicating the offices were still that, while low volume, they did roughly twice business as the typical as much Western post office of the day. The relatively high proportion of larger offices, plus the small number of new offices established during Doane era, is believed to have minthe distribution of Doane imized devices to the State of Utah.

Only 73 Utah post offices are known to have used Doane cancellations. No offices are known to have used more than one device. offices have been documented using Type 1 devices, 45 offices used Type 2 Doanes and 20 offices are known to


have used Type 3.

The earliest use of a Type 1 device dates from 24 November 1903 at LA VERKIN. RICHARDSON was using a Type 2 Doane on 7 December 1903 for the earliest known use of that type. The earliest Type 3 dates from 18 October 1905 at HOYTSVILLE.

Probably as many as 160 Utah post offices actually used Doanes. 160 Utah There were only 28 as yet undocumented offices established between 1903 and 1906, but it is anticipated that a fair number of old offices, of which we have no report, received Doane equipment.







## WYOMING

Wyoming had only half the population of its neighbors Idaho, Utah and Montana in the early 20th century, but it had more post offices than Utah. The economy of the state was largely geared -toward mining grazing copper and coal, and cattle and sheep. There were 50 sheep for every person in Wyoming in 1910, a fact which helped explain the settlement pattern of tiny ranch centers widely spread across the vast Population growth during the plains. was moderate by Western decade standards, as the 101,816 of 1900 grew to 145,965 by 1910.


The number of Wyoming post offices as of June 30, 1905, was 338.

Most were quite low volume offices, and Doane distribution is expected to have been about average for the West in Wyoming.


Wyoming post offices currently known to have used Doanes number 96. Only one office, FORT RUSSELL, is known to have used more than one type; in this case both Type 1 and Type 3. Seven offices used Type 1 Doanes, 55 used Type 2 Doanes, and 35 offices are known to have used Type 3.


The carliest recorded use in the state is 2 November 1903, a Type 1 Doane used at WIDDOWFIELD. Following rather closely is MONA's use of a Type 2 on 27 November 1903. The earliest use of a Type 3 dates from 31 August 1905 at MARQUETTE.


The best estimate of the total number of Wyoming offices using Doanes is about 170. If this number is accurate, our listing is a bit less than 60% complete.




