

Margarete promises that she has other stories to share with us in the future, so let's give her whatever assistance we can with her current puzzle and let her know that we appreciate her work.



# HANDSTAMP CENSOR MARKINGS of the UNITED STATES FLEET DURING WORLD WAR I

(APRIL 6, 1917 to NOVEMBER 11, 1918)

In early 1917, an event occurred that was contrary to the long-time desires of the President, the Congress, and for the most part, the citizenry of the United States. On April 6, 1917, the United States declared war against Germany in what was regarded as the *European* war, an involvement that would last until November 11, 1918, inspire the concept of the United Nations (League of Nations), and see the United States emerge as one of the truely powerful nations in the world.

Virtually without exception, United States forces were ill-prepared to mount a military expedition anywhere, attributed (historically) to the nation's prevailing isolationistic policies. The Army was understrength and lacked training; the Navy was in transition, even after Teddy Roosevelt's grandstand effort to 'show the flag' by sending the "Great White Fleet" around the world, relying upon colliers to supply fuel to a generally coal-fired fleet while commissioning new oil-fired battleships for which there were insufficient fuel sources away from America's shores. The Marines, in particular their aviation units, were resented by both the Army and Navy (even though Marine Air squadrons were the only United States aviation units to see combat!).

The postal history, and related aspects, of the United States' military in World War I has been examined, and continues to be expanded. As example, a second edition of *The Postal History of the AEF* has recently been published. Within that work, a good many pages are devoted to describing postal censorship, and to showing censorship markings used during World War I, albeit only a few such markings of naval origin.

A nagging question throughout the preparation for this census of handstamp censor markings concerns the overall regularity of Army censor markings vs. the consistent dissimilarity of Naval censor markings. The only explanation postulated thus far reasons that the Army (War Dept) had available a time period from April 6 until large-scale troop dispositions to France in late-1917 to effect a logistical supply system, including production of handstamps, whereas the Navy, mobile and already underway, was left to their own devices. General Orders, dictating the conduct of Army postal censorship, were issued by AEF headquarters in July, 1917, shortly after the first combat troops arrived in France. No companion Orders have been found originating within the Navy Department, even though the earliest U.S. Naval censor marking in this study is dated April 7, 1917 (USS ARIZONA), the day after war was declared by the United States. Note: A similar cover, postmarked April 6, 1917 from ARIZONA, bears no censor marking.

While it is recognized that censor markings are not postal markings, it is hoped that this listing will expand the existing base of information available for use by postal historians. The overriding purpose of this study derives of a need to *identify the origin* of a postally-used cover for which usual identity clues are absent.




Figure 1.Fig. 1: A "provisional" (Locy Type P) postmark from FLORIDA showing the (a) dater circle, (b) U.S.S., (c) FLORIDA, and (d) killer bars have been cut away; only date and killer wording slots being used.

Some ships of the United States Fleet in the latter half of 1917, perhaps as a result of General Orders establishing the rules of censorship, 'modified' their postmarking devices to delete the ship's name. In some instances (FLORIDA, TRUXTUN), the dater circle, 'USS', and ship's name were cut away leaving only the day, month, and year slug spaces operative (Fig. 1). Too, covers found dated during this same period invariably have only the senders name

as the return address, sometimes the FPO, but seldom the name of the ship in which the sender was serving. Later, and apparently as censorship rules were eased, the senders name is commonly seen accompanied with the ship's name and FPO.

The "existing" studies relating to Naval censor-ship markings are few - very few. An initial 'study' was prepared in 1933 by Delf Norona, a pioneer in matters postal. To his credit, there appeared a rather lengthy listing of ships, censorship handstamps seen on cover from each, traced examples, and a system for classification. Covers from all of the ships listed in the Norona study have yet to be found for this examination, while a number of covers from ships not listed by Norona have been. Of the present group of examples, there is a greater diversity - or individuality - of handstamps presented when compared to those originally noted by Norona.

A basic difference between this and the 1933 Norona study seems to be scope. Norona listed the use of censor handstamps found on WW1 U. S. Naval covers without regard to the censoring station:

"In some cases it is evident that censor marks were not applied on board the ship on which the letter was written, and that letters were taken ashore or to another vessel and there postmarked and censored....From the above it is apparent that the censor marks were not in all cases actually applied on board the particular ship to which they are credited in the check list." [Norona, 1933, p.70]




Figure 2. Portion of an official Navy ('penalty') cover showing use of the Manila military (U.S. Army) censor marking (Reduced) (Courtesy, R. D. Rawlins).

This present effort is intended to produce a list of the censor handstamp(s) employed by a specific ship, and thus to provide an identifying mechanism for covers from U. S. Naval ships. In this regard, censor handstamps known to have been used at/by shore stations, even though found on 'ship' covers, are NOT included (except as an Appendix). As example (Fig. 2), a censor stamp found on a naval cover dated June 21, 1918, from the Commanding Officer, U.S.S. Monadnock, is of the format known to have been used by the military (Army) at Manila. (This same censor marking is listed by Norona as being seen on covers from AJAX, ELCANO, GEN-ERAL ALAVA, HELENA, and WYOMPATUCK.) In any event, whether the censor marking was applied at a Manila shore station, or aboard one of the listed ships, this handstamp's 'non-specific' use would compromise the effort to identify a sole source (ship). While no two censor handstamps, used exclu-

sively aboard different ships, have yet been found exactly alike, such a handstamp, when found apparently used by more than one ship, may obviate its usefulness in identifying a specific ship and might be excluded. As an example, CHICAGO operated as a tender to both submarines and destroyer-torpedo boats. It would be likely that a letter, written by a sailor in one of the 'tended' submarines and including a hand-written return address identifying that submarine, might well have been censored and mailed from CHICAGO which had an operational post office, thus showing the tender's censor marking, not that of the submarine. This situation becomes more complicated when a censor officer applies a marking aboard the submarine, and forwards the censored cover to the tender, which uses a distinctive postmark unique to the tender, giving the impression that the mail (and censor marking) originated aboard the tender, and not the submarine.

Lastly, there are those situations where letters written and censored aboard ship have been mailed at a (civilian) port postal facility, even though the ship had an operational post office. This was common when the ship returned from overseas for refit, overhaul, provisioning, etc., censoring officers found the postal clerk on 'liberty', and the Port post office a short distance away. It is not expected that many such covers have found their way into collec-

tions for the ship's postmark was not used and the postal item does not appear to be Naval in origin.

There are problems that have been, and will be encountered in an examination of this type. One can assume that the captain of a Navy vessel was charged with the responsibility for censorship of out-going mail. Recognizing that a battleship of the day employed some 1000 men, and that active combat operations might well prevail upon the Captain's time, logic dictates that censorship functions were delegated [upon transfer, did the 'censoring officer(s)' retain his handstamp for use at the new duty station?]. Alternatively, ships with a small complement, not provided with postal facilities, referred their (censored?) mail to a larger ship with a post office. It is not uncommon to find a cover from a ship for which a censor handstamp is known (BAIN-BRIDGE) but has not yet been identified as having a post office, though a sister-ship (same class and complement) is known to have had on-board postal service (PREBLE), but no censor handstamp marking has vet been reported.

The consistency over time of censor markings from any listed ship, for which actual 'hands-on' examination was possible, tends to lend validity to the applicability of this tabulation, even in its present form. The handstamp censor markings appearing in this census have been taken from covers upon which the ship is/can be identified. (Censor markings from the Norona listing of 1933 have been included only when the marking was identified as being used by a single ship.) The reader may well expect that other markings will become known with time, and interest in the subject. Too, some of the markings now included may be discarded when reports identify a given marking being found on cover(s) from a ship other than the one listed. Readers are invited to report any new marking, or date extensions of listed markings, to the Editor, *La Posta*, or to the author.

One of the truely gratifying aspects of initiating a study such as this was the great number of supporters who provided advice and suggestion, copies of covers from their collections, or even the covers themselves. This welcomed help by postal historians, and cover collectors, -- all helping toward an initial effort as complete as possible -- was in stark contrast to the few philatelic 'collegues' who expressed dark reservations toward the viability of this study. Help on any census project of this sort is always welcomed. My appreciation is extended to all that helped, but especially to *La Posta* Editor Bill Helbock (without

'pushing', he encouraged continued efforts toward completion); R. D. Rawlins; D. A. Kent; R. Burns; P. A. Helman; A. LaShell; J. Davenport; and R. Pence.

The following reproductions of handstamp censor markings number more than ninety. Their arrangement is from simple to complex, smaller to larger, shorter to longer. In that most of the devices used to make the censor impression were of rubber, the reader should expect that some dimensional variability will be encountered when attempting to match a given marking.

CAUTION: This listing is not intended to be used as a scarcity/ valuation tool. There are several reasons why a marking may not appear: the marking was not found by/reported to the author previous to publishing deadlines; studies may be on-going to determine if a marking not shown is unique to a specific ship; or markings not shown have been found to have been used by several ships, and thus excluded.

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




Figure 1. This postmaster freee franked stampless folded letter from Rock Island, Tennessee, bears some very interesting handstamp markings. The author seeks to learn whether the cover and its markings are real or bogus.

## **BOGUS OR AUTHENTIC?**

## By Margarete W. Faber

The cover illustrated above was acquired at a show in Saint Louis. Because it was labelled bogus, it was to be an addition to our "doctored" cover collection. After careful examination, however, it appeared to be genuine. It even has a genuine "feel". The cover was sent from Rock Island, Tennessee, to Norfolk, Virginia, on February 4, 1838, and carries a manuscript postmark and matching manuscript postmaster free frank, as well as a "FREE" handstamp. In addition, there are several unfamiliar handstamps including "P&O R"; "PONY/EXPRESS/MAIL" in a sunburst; and "PD 4" with high small "D" in a circle. All handstamps are black.

Much of the cover's appearance is characteristic of stampless covers. The presence of manuscript post office, postmaster and free markings along with an additions "FREE" handstamp is commonplace in postmaster free franked covers. However, the additional handstamps are not common. The seller knew nothing about the cover other than that indicated by the "bogus" label. We decided to

research this cover to determine, if possible, its authenticity.

The cover was sent by Postmaster John B. Rodgers. The contents of the folded letter are concerned with land holdings of the addressee, Jonathan Southgate, Esq., and the titles to and disposal of such lands. Docketing on the back of the cover indicates that the writer was a general.

The first step in our research was to consult the available postal history literature. A complete list of the sources consulted appears at the end of this article. After exhausting libraries resources at home, at Indiana University, and the American Philatelic Research Library, a site visit seemed to be in order. Accordingly, we visited the Tennessee State Library in Nashville, the towns in area in which Postmaster Rodgers lived and practiced law, and the town in which he served as postmaster. We sought information not only about John B. Rodgers, but about the mysterious markings "P&O R", "PONY EXPRESS MAIL" and "PD 4". To that end, we read letters in the archives of the Tennessee State Library, books, and newspapers of the day which have been preserved on microfilm.

John B. Rodgers was a real person. He served in the War of 1812, fought with Andrew Jackson in the Seminole War of 1818, was elected Attorney General of the State of Tennessee in 1823, and was appointed Brigadier General in the War of Texas Independence. In 1831 he resigned the post of State Attorney General to return to private life and practice law in Sparta and McMinnville, Tennessee. He was subsequently appointed postmaster of Rock Island, Tennessee, and served in that capacity from December 12, 1835 to September 23, 1845.

A road sign at the northeast corner of Rock Island Road (Highway 70S) and Great Falls Road in Rock Island reads:

Rodgers Tavern — This tavern on the Kentucky-Alabama Road was established by John B. Rodgers, veteran of the War of 1812, and of Jackson's Florida Campaign. He also operated Rodgers' Ferry, 0.4 mi NE, opposite the island which gave this town its name.

This tavern was the likely location of the post office as was the custom of the day. It was located across the highway from the present day post office.

Rodgers was also a landowner and developer. He built the first summer resort in the South at Bon Air, Tennessee. At the outbreak of the Civil War he refused a commission in both the Confederate and Union armies, and remained loyal to the Union. This loyalty cost him his property and wealth. He was forced to flee his home and his property was seized. His personal papers and military momentos were stolen or destroyed.

Pony express routes were operated in various parts of America's East and South at the time this cover was mailed. Numerous citations of such services may be found in the literature. Although mail service into this part of the South had been provided by horse and rider or stage coach since the early 1800's, the Post Office Department attempted to speed up the delivery of mail to the western frontier through horse carried light mail loads. This was an attempt both to improve mail service and to break the hold the railroads had on the post office budget. Private express companies also existed during this period.

Newspapers of the day covered the spread of express mails westward, and about the time express mail arrived in the area the *Nashville Union* established a column headlined "BY LAST NIGHT'S EXPRESS MAIL" under the illustration of a rider on horseback holding a horn from which issued the

word "NEWS!". This illustration first appeared on March 28, 1838, and lasted until July 2, 1838.

William Lawrence, Conservator of the Wylie House and Assistant to the Indiana University Curator, has examined the letter both visually and under ultraviolet light and feels both it and the handstamps are genuine. His reasoning is as follows: the paper fibers are broken across the ink; the paper folding occurred after the handstamps were applied; the sunburst rays and letters are worn on the folds. The bleeding of the ink, of which there is almost none, is the same on all the handcancels. If different inks had been applied in different time periods, as in a later forgery, there would be color differences. More recent inks do not age in the same manner, despite exposure to various elements.

Lawrence suggests the "P&O" is a single stamp. The "R" may have come from a separate cancel or a replaceable letter. The rays around "PONY/EXPRESS/MAIL" were impressed from a fine grained hardwood such as maple, or a soft metal such as brass or copper. The handstamp was not of iron. The sunburst had been stamped on top of the "R", which would indicate that the "PO& R" was applied first (Figure 2). It is possible that the "PD" was one stamp and the "4" was separate. The "4" is lower and tilted slightly to the right (Figure 3).

To the best of our knowledge, no other markings of this type have been documented. We found

no similar examples in the literature of postal history, and the Tennessee archives we examined yielded no information on such postal markings. While free mail was not supposed to be delivered by express mail at the time of the date of this cover, there are documented instances where this occurred. If this letter was carried only by private mail, one would not expect the "FREE" to have meaning. Mr. Lawrence suggests the "PO& R" may be an owner's name, or perhaps a canal or stage line. There is no railroad line documented using such a cancel.

Our research to date, as evidenced in this article, has raised as many questions as it has answered. We plan to undertake further investigations, and request that any reader with additional information about these issues or areas of postal history—whether or not it lends credence to the authenticity of the cover — contact us. At this point, we are leaning strongly toward Mr. Lawrence's opinion of genuineness. If so, it would appear to be the lone example of an exciting period of southern postal history.

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


Fig. 1. Stampless cover postmarked Geo. Town (Georgetown) mailed in 1790 to Philadelphia. (ex Turner)

## Independent Post Offices in the District of Columbia

The purpose of this brief study is to record examples from all the known <u>fully independent</u> post offices which were established in the District of Columbia, also known as Washington, D. C. These post offices had their own postmaster and a regular mail service. Some offices were in operation for only a short time and were discontinued, or incorporated into other offices.

Between 1788 and 1789 the states of Maryland and Virginia ceded land to the United States Government. This territory became known as the District of Columbia, and as such was accepted by the United States Congress in July 1790 under authority granted by the Constitution to set up a seat of government. On March 30, 1791, President George Washington proclaimed that these land tracts be known as the District of Columbia. On April 1, 1791 this act formally took effect. That area included the towns of Alexandria and Georgetown which were thriving seaports before the Revolutionary War. A third community which was originally located in Maryland was first designated the Capitol City or the Federal City. A Congressional Act of May 6, 1796 named it

the City of Washington, but throughout the 19th century it was usually referred as Washington City.

In the 18th century, three post offices were established in the District of Columbia. The first office was Georgetown, which originally belonged to Maryland. The first postmaster at Georgetown was John C. Wiley, and this office began operating as a post office in the District of Columbia on December 23, 1788. Shown in Figure 1 is a folded letter sent to Philadelphia which was used from Georgetown in 1790.

The next post office, Alexandria, was located in Virginia and was ceded to the District of Columbia on March 30, 1791. Its first postmaster was Allen B. Clayton. Shown in Figure 2 is a folded letter without handstamp markings written at Alexandria in 1785, when it still belonged to Virginia. It was also sent to Philadelphia. The folded letter shown in Figure 3 was postmarked at Alexandria on August 4, 1793, when it was part of the District of Columbia. This letter was sent to the Vice Consul of the French Republic at Baltimore, Maryland. The Virginia portion of the District of Columbia was retroceded back to Virginia by Act of Congress of July 9, 1846.

The final post office, Washington City, was originally established in Maryland on June 1, 1795, after its population and business had grown suffi-






Fig. 4. Stampless cover postmarked WASH-CITY / SEP 1 (1799) addressed to John Hancock in Boston. (ex Turner)

ciently. This office was transferred to the District of Columbia on January 30, 1799. The postal records however, continued to show the new town to be associated with Maryland until the first Monday in December 1800, when the United States began to exercise exclusive jurisdiction over the federal district. It's first postmaster was Thomas Munroe. Shown in Figure 4 is a folded letter sent from Washington City on September 1, 1799 to John Hancock at Boston, Massachusetts.

Thomas Munroe and the three postmasters who preceded him as Postmaster of Washington City were appointed to their jobs because of personal relationships with George Washington. They were appointed by Postmaster General Joseph Habersham. The first, Thomas Johnson, Jr., was appointed on June 14, 1795. He died in late December, 1795. The second, Christopher Richmond was appointed on November 11, 1795. He died eight and one-half months later.

The third postmaster was Lund Washington who was appointed on May 26, 1796. Two months after his appointment, the Postmaster General allowed him to charge 30 per cent commission on the two winter quarterly periods in which he was obliged to rise at the "unseasonable hour of 5 a.m." to handle the mails three times a week. The large income of the office and perhaps his unfortunate habits, brought him into difficulties, and he was dismissed as a defaulter in January, 1799.

One of the most prolific collectors of postal history of the District of Columbia was the late George Turner, who for the past 15 years of his life resided in Washington, D. C. When George's name comes to mind, one usually thinks of his vast philatelic library which was the largest in private hands at the time of his death. Not too many people were aware of his vast holdings of postal history. His collection of postal history of the District of Columbia, consisting of over 4,000 covers, was willed to the Washington Philatelic Society (WPS), of which I am a resident member. This collection is to form the basis for publishing a book on the Postal History of the District of Columbia, which is currently in process by the WPS. The covers in the Turner collection which are illustrated in this article are shown with the permission of the WPS

Shown in Figure 5 is a chart I prepared which lists all of the post offices which were established within the boundary of the District of Columbia. This chart also shows the date the post office was established

and the date it was discontinued, as well as other important information.

I was able to view the covers in the Turner collection, and together with the covers in my own collection, I have recorded the number of covers in both of our collections from each of these post offices. The counts for the covers from the Alexandria, Georgetown and Washington offices only include stampless covers. As you can see from the chart, many of these post offices appear to be very scarce, as I have not recorded any examples used from the following 18 offices:

Alexandria Ferry, which was open only six and one half months in 1856; Benning or Benning's which was open for almost 30 years; Brooks which was open for almost three years before the name was changed to Brookland; Congress Heights which was open for almost 10 years; Deanwood which was open for a little over 10 years (a cover from this office appeared in a recent LaPosta subscribers auction).

In addition, Garfield which was open a total of eight and one half years during two separate periods; Ivy City which was open for more than five years; Kenilworth open for a little more than three years; and Langdon which was open for almost seven years during two separate independent periods. Also Mills open for over three years; Montrose open for less than one year; Mount Pleasant open for three and one half years during two separate periods; and Oak Grove or Oakgrove which was open during three separate periods for more than 10 years.

Finally, Saint Elizabeth open for less than one year; St. Albans open a little more than three months; Twining open for six years during two separate periods; Union Town open for four years after the Civil War; and University which was open a little more than a year.

When George Turner was alive, he purchased practically every cover that came his way related to Washington, D. C. Several of the smaller post offices in the District of Columbia were open for only a short time, and examples from some offices may not even exist. Some offices which were open for a few years are very difficult, if not impossible to locate in dealer's stocks.

I would like to be able to illustrate an example from each office that existed in the District of Columbia, but currently this is not possible since examples from some of these post offices do not exist in either the Turner collection or my own, which is not




Fig 6. Cover postmarked ANACOSTIA / D.C. on January 11, 1881 used to San Francisco.

that extensive. I have selected examples from the offices which I have recorded examples and they are described as follows:


Illustrated in Figure 6 is a cover used on January 11, 1881 from the Anacostia office which was sent to San Francisco. The cover shown in Figure 7 is circa 1865 and contains a manuscript cancel of Brightwood D. C. / Oct 11. The address on this cover has been neatly erased. Figure 8 consists of another cover used from the Brightwood office which was sent to England in the 1880's. The cover shown in Figure 9 was used from the Brookland office on December 7, 1891 and was used within the city of Washington, D. C.

Figure 10 consists of a stampless cover mailed by the postmaster of the College Hill post office in 1833. At the top of the cover he has written "S. Chapin, P. M. Col. Hill, D. C. / May 22 / Free". Shown in Figure 11 is a cover used from the Good Hope post office on November 8, 1898. This cover was sent to Philadelphia, via the Anacostia, D. C. office. The next two covers were used from the unusual named post office of Pathfinder. The Figure 12 cover is a newspaper wrapper used in 1900 from the Pathfinder Publishing Company. The other cover shown in Figure 13 was also used in 1900 and is another wrapper mailed to Slaterbury, Connecticut






Fig. 16. Patriotic envelope used from TENNALLYTOWN / D.C. to Pennsylvania. (ex Turner)

The next two illustrations are covers mailed from the Takoma Park office. The first, Figure 14 was used locally on August 13, 1892. Shown in Figure 15 is a another local use of March 27, 1898 with a non-standard hand cancel. The next two covers, were used on Civil War era envelopes from the Tennallytown office. Figure 16 is an Iowa patriotic cover used to Pennsylvania which is very colorful. The








Fig. 17. U. S.




Fig. 19. Envelope postmarked WINTHROP HEIGHTS / D.C. on May 27, 1896 used to Wisuer, Michigan. (ex Turner)

# LIST OF RAILROAD-RELATED MAIL SERVICE INTERRUPTIONS WHICH OCCURRED IN THE UNITED STATES

#### Seventh in a Series



[Writer's note: In the Sixth of this Series, on pages 54 and 55, the markings did not print very well in the illustrations. The wording on each of the markings is repeated now for clarity. Marking No. 1902-03-27 on the top of page 54 reads "Damaged By Wreck On Yazoo &/Miss Valley R R Tr 5 M'ch. 27,'02". Marking No. 1931-11-22 in the middle of page 55 reads "Damaged in Train wreck/Oelwein&KC.3 Nov. 22".]

#### INTERRUPTION NO. 1946-05-04

The United States was suffering from the effects of a bituminous coal strike which had begun five weeks prior to the date of this mishap. In reaction to the strike which had forced big cities such as Chicago, Illinois and Washington, D.C. to start "brownouts" and threatened to cause general industrial and business paralysis, the Federal Government ordered a fifty percent cut in railroad passenger service, the cut to take affect on 15 May 1946. With senators demanding a presidential seizure of U.S. coal mines, President Harry Truman, on the 4th of May in that year, called the strike a "national disaster" and warned that "from now on, the effects of the strike (would) spread so rapidly throughout the nation's economy that it (would) take months to mend the damage to reconversion progress".


The Seaboard trains had scheduled runs from Hamlet, North Carolina to Jacksonville, Florida via Savannah, Georgia. On the 4th of May 1946, a fire occurred in the mail car of Seaboard's Train No. 2 while that train was en route to Savannah. The mail recovered was forwarded to the Savannah Post Office for processing. There, postal officials prepared labels which accompanied the mail items involved in the fire when the items were returned to the mail.

INTERRUPTION NO. 1947-02-18

The Pennsylvania Railroad's crack night flier, the "Red Arrow", provided service between Detroit, Michigan and New York City, New York via Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. On this run, the "Red Arrow" consisted of

two locomotives and fourteen railway cars. The train was scheduled to depart Pittsburgh at midnight; however, it did not begin its eastbound run until 1:05 o'clock the morning of 18 February 1947. At 3:52 o'clock that morning, the "Red Arrow" was some ten miles west of Altoona, Pennsylvania, going down grade at a location known as Bennington Curve when it left the rails, tore up several hundred feet of track and ties, and then plunged down a hillside and into a 150 foot ravine known as Gum Tree Hollow. All but the four rear cars left the tracks. A RPO car was among the cars that wrecked. A newspaper account, under the heading of "Tragedy of Mail Clerks", noted that:

"One of the most tragic features of the wreck of the Red Arrow was the fate that befell the railway mail clerks who were engaged on the train. Out of a total of 10 who were busy with their tasks six lost their lives, while the others were more or less seriously injured.

The character of their duties did not lend to thrust them into the limelight. Working continuously aboard trains, they were more or less behind the scenes, but they were honorable, conscientious and dependable and they played an important part in making the transportation and delivery of mails a highly efficient branch of our government and railway transportation. It may be that many of us do not fully realize the implications of this service, that, as we receive our mail from day to day, we do not appreciate the high quality of performance given by such men. . .

They died in the harness, valiant figures in an important public function. . . "

In another, related article, the newspaper reported that the railroads, notably the Pennsylvania, had made great strides through the introduction of safety devices and the enforcement of rigid rules of safety. The article also stated that:


"The underlying cause of this accident will be revealed by the rigid investigation which the railroad company and the constituted authorities will make. Whatever may have been the cause, we may have the assurance that such accidents are not inescapable, but on the contrary, out of the sorrows which they entail, there will come, at an accelerated pace, greater efforts than ever before on the part of the railroad company to promote safety.

Transportation by rail will continue to be the safest and most economical way of moving freight and passengers. The railroads have been greatly hampered by excessive taxation which has made it exceedingly difficult for them to maintain tracks and equipment as they would like to have them.

This is not to imply that there was anything wrong with the tracks where the wreck occurred. The facts as to the causes of the wreck will be cleared up. But it does clearly indicate that the railroads must not be deprived of the means of keeping roadbeds and equipment in the best possible condition."

From the mail salvaged from this wreck and seen by the writer, it is surmised that there was no particular post office to which the mail was delivered for processing. Some of the mail was recovered undamaged. A photograph attributed to the <u>Sun-Telegraph</u> newspaper showed members of the Pennsylvania State Police and the railroad police guarding a number of mail bags that had been retrieved intact and undamaged. The writer speculates that this mail was forwarded without an identifying mark.

The Altoona Mirror newspaper published a photograph which showed workmen using acetylene torches to cut away metal framework of the RPO car. It was noted under that photograph that "(g) reat care had to be exercised to avoid setting fire to scattered mail in the car." [The writer's reproduction of these photographs is not legible enough to be illustrated herein.] Those mail items recovered in damaged condition seemingly were forwarded to their destination, where explanations - mostly affixed in manuscript - were added. Damaged mail items were salvaged from the wreckage over a period that extended a least two months after the mishap.







This is one of those railroad mishaps about which the writer has not been able to find any information, except that information which was contained in the Post Office notice and derived from the cover. [Does anyone have more information in regard to the events which surrounded this interruption?]

A fire occurred in a railroad mail car on this date. Evidently a part of the mail shipment aboard the train was destined for Pittsfield, Massachusetts. The mail recovered was processed at the Albany, New York Post Office. Over the title of Postmaster and the name of A.D. Jeffers, Assistant Superintendent Mails, a two paragraph letter, dated 16 March 1965, was prepared on standard eight and one-half inch by eleven inch paper. A copy of that letter was forwarded with each damaged mail item recovered from this fire.



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


Figure 1. This postcard displays an example of the SO. SUDBURY, MASS. handstamp flag cancel. Handstamp flags of this design are classed as Type E.6 in our study of non-standard markings.

# 20TH CENTURY NON-STANDARD POSTMARKING & CANCELING DEVICES

Part 22 - Catalog Section, Types E.6 - E.10

By Randy Stehle and Doug DeRoest

This section concludes the presentation of the handstamp flag cancels (Types E.6 - E.10). We will also show several new discoveries since the last section and correct one prior listing.

One new town, Cushman, AR (Type E.6-135) was recently reported and is shown below. Another town -- Harrison, NE --which was reported with five handstamp flag varieties last time, has had two additional varieties identified by Larry Haller, a specialist in these markings. These two new varieties (Types E.6-345 and E.6-355) appear quite similar to Type E.6-350, which appeared last time. The only significant difference among these three varieties is the space between the postmark dial and the flag. In the previously reported Type E.6-350 the space is two millimeters. In the newly reported varieties the space is five millimeters in Type E.6-345 and four millimeters in Type E.6-355. These new discoveries have made Harrison, NE, the post office which used

the greatest number of non-standard devices in our survey. Thus far, we have recorded ten different non-standard postmarks from Harrison: seven hand-stamp flags, one 4-bar mimic and two different wavy line killer markings (Type I).


The correction involves the handstamp flag from Churubusco, IN. Last time we identified this flag as Type E.6 (a flag killer with normal stripes and die space). Both Langford and Haller had previously listed the Churubusco flag in this manner. All copies seen by author Stehle were not well struck or had the flag killer running off the card. For this reason we listed the "die space" information as "unknown" last time. When the last article was submitted for publication, the authors request that editor Helbock supply an appropriate illustration. As fate, or Murphy's Law, would have it, the editor selected an example from Subscribers' Auction No. 46 because it was a particularly nice strike from Churubusco, IN. Therefore, the article went to press without the authors seeing this particular handstamp flag. It turns out that the marking is really Type E.5 (flag killer with short stripes). Author DeRoest called author Stehle to

register his amazement at seeing the illustration n the recently arrived *La Posta*. As of today (November 12th), no one else has let either of us know of this misclassification. To rectify the situation, the original listing of Churubusco as Type E.6-110 has been changed to Type E.5-5 in this compilation below.

In our listing we report one type of handstamp flag which differs from the original Langford scheme. We know of only one town -- Henrietta, NY -- which used this design in which the flag killer is not as long as "normal" flags but not as short as the Type E.5 flags. This variety is classified as Type E.9.

The Type E.10 flag, known only from Point Roberts, WA, also deserves a word of explanation. This marking was made with a steel non-integral device. While any non-standard steel device has been considered part of our study, we have tried to exclude any markings which were made by non-integral equipment, that is, markings which resulted when the postmark dial and the killer were made by two separate devices. We decided to make an exception for the Point Roberts flag. It is a fairly common marking and has been documented in Langford's Flag Cancel Encyclopedia. In order to avoid anticipated confusion, and because it is the only recorded non-integral flag, we included it. So far, it is the only exception to our "non-integral" rule out of the more than 3,000 postmarks recorded in this study.

The total number of non-standard cancels recorded has benefited from a burst of new finds lately. Our number stands at 3,074, which is 634 more than last time. Please write direct with your new reports and discoveries to Randy Stehle, 16 Iris Court, San Mateo, CA 94401.
